Ordinance/BMP Committee Announces LID Presentation Series

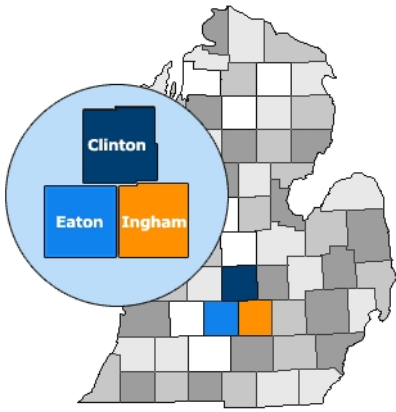

Habitat & Recreation Committee Focuses on the Data

Over the last few years, the GLRC Habitat and Recreation Committee has been collecting water quality monitoring data for the Red Cedar, Grand, and Looking River Watersheds. These efforts include all historical data and the continued incorporation of current monitoring efforts and results.

Strategically planned, with very limited resources, and with the help of Delhi Twp's GIS staff person, we have developed a comprehensive database for all different classifications of water quality data including E.Coli, macroinvertebrates, chemical, habitat and visual assessments, fish counts, etc.

Now that the Habitat & Recreation Committee has this information in a usable format, we will be developing a detailed water quality report for GLRC members. The committee will develop specific recommendations that will include additional monitoring sites, recreational opportunities, potential conservation areas, and much more.
