# Dear Residents:

As we well remember, on December 21, 2013, a major storm system moved into the Great Lakes region, bringing a mix of freezing rain, sleet, and snow to our region. Extremely slick roads developed, but the primary impact was the large-scale power outages that affected hundreds of thousands of residents in Delta Township and across Lower Michigan.

Due to the severity of the storm, the Delta Township Emergency Operations Center (EOC) was activated on Sunday, December 22. Several representatives from the Emergency Management Division reported to the EOC almost immediately to mitigate any damages and develop a recovery plan. Several sections of Delta Township's Emergency Operations Plan were implemented.

During the emergency, EOC officials performed many duties and functions, such as coordinating fire and EMS responses, public safety, identifying and evaluating the high-risk population and residents, and communicating with the Lansing Board of Water & Light and Consumers Energy regarding current status and important updates.

During this major event, the Delta Township Fire Department responded to more than 250 emergency calls for service in a 48-hour period of which approximately 150 of these calls were within the first 12 hours after the storm started. The on-duty fire department personnel remained at the stations after their normal shifts were completed and each and every one of the department's off-duty personnel responded back to the station to assist in the high volume of calls received.

Here in Delta Township, we are very fortunate to have our own Emergency Management Division under the direction of Emergency Manager John C. Clark, who is also the chief of our fire department. The Emergency Management Division prepares for all types of emergencies, both natural and man-made, so that mitigation and planning can take place as soon as possible in the event of a threat to Delta Township residents, workers, and visitors. Preparation and training is key to the smooth operation of all subsections of the Emergency Management Division.

Some of the pre-established procedures and protocols used during this severe weather event included posting current information on our Facebook and website, making television announcements and posting Nixle updates via public safety announcements. In addition, EOC personnel assisted with locating warming centers and temporary shelters.

Being prepared for disasters and emergencies can seem like a big job. Many people do not know where to start, so they never start at all. There are several ways in which you can try to prepare for disasters and emergencies. With **Do1Thing** you can take small steps that make a big difference in an emergency (see page 12 in this magazine for additional information). Another very helpful tool is Smart911. Smart911 is a service that allows residents to create a free safety profile for their household that includes any information they want 911 operators and first responders to have in the event of an emergency. To sign up and to receive additional information, visit [www.smart911.com](http://www.smart911.com).

Last, but not least, Nixle is an excellent communication tool to receive information from public safety entities. The Nixle service allows government agencies to send messages to local residents via text, email and web. Information is delivered almost instantly. Please take the time to do at least one, if not all of the above measures to protect you and your family during the next disaster or emergency our community might experience in the future.





## Become Better Prepared for Emergencies and Disasters

Delta Township has partnered with **Do1Thing**, because every step you take in becoming prepared will help first responders, your loved ones, and others in your community.

We all want to be better prepared for emergencies and disasters.

Emergency preparedness is a big job, so many people never get started.

**Do1Thing** is a web-based, twelve-month preparedness program that focuses on a different area of emergency preparedness each month.

Emergency preparedness doesn't have to be hard or expensive. **Do1Thing** a month and in a year you will:

- Find out how to have and store 72 hours (3 days) worth of water for your household.
- Remember important items that may be overlooked when leaving your home.
- Make sure the people that depend on you are prepared for disaster.
- Have a food supply that will meet the needs of your household for three days without outside assistance.
- Know how to respond safely when instructions are given to evacuate or take shelter.
- Have the ability to locate and communicate with family members during a disaster.
- Make sure everyone in your household can receive, understand, and act on information received in an emergency.
- Make your community stronger by getting trained and getting involved.
- Be prepared to handle emergencies without outside assistance for 72 hours.
- Be prepared to deal with medical emergencies while waiting for first responders.
- Know what to do when the power goes out.

Visit [www.do1thing.com](http://www.do1thing.com) each month. Choose one thing to do for that month. Do that one thing. By the end of the year you and your family will be better prepared for an emergency.

The calendar repeats every year, so you can start anytime.



## Noxious Weeds

Walter Kulasa, in the Township's Community Development Department, is the Township's Commissioner of Noxious Weeds. Starting on April 15, 2014 please call 323-8540 or visit [www.deltami.gov](http://www.deltami.gov) to report a lot that is suspected to be in violation.

The Township's Weed Ordinance requires: the occupant of every premises and the owner of unoccupied premises within the Township, to cut and remove or destroy by lawful means all such noxious weeds and grass, as often as may be necessary throughout the growing season, which shall be **April 15 through October 31** of each year, to remain in compliance with the provisions herein.

Grasses and weeds not cut, removed or destroyed by April 15, 2014, and further maintained as often as necessary to remain in compliance through October 31, 2013, may be cut by the Parks, Recreation, and Cemeteries Department of Delta Township. The owner of the property will be charged with the cost of \$68.34 investigation charge, \$77.65 per hour mowing charge, and any other expense that may be incurred due to the violation, plus 10% overhead, with a minimum charge of \$189.05. Charges not paid before September 1, 2014, are deemed delinquent, and the cost is assessed against the property of the taxpayers as shown on the tax roll.

### Should You be Paying City Income Tax?

With income tax time rapidly approaching, Delta Township wanted to eliminate some of the confusion residents have with regard to the issue of City of Lansing income tax. Delta Township does not have an income tax. Some Delta Township residents with a Lansing address may believe they owe income tax; or, more frequently their employer may have withheld city income tax over the year.

Many times an employer will automatically withhold taxes when the address is Lansing. A Lansing address relates only to the United States Postal authorities for delivering mail. A Lansing address may mean that a person lives in Delta Township and therefore is not subject to city tax.

- Persons living in the City of Lansing pay a one percent tax, no matter where they work.
- Delta residents that work in the City of Lansing pay a one-half percent income tax.
- The following businesses located in Delta Township are subject to city income tax: GM-Delta Manufacturing Complex, located on Millett Highway, JCIM (Johnson Control Interior Manufacturing), Bridgewater Interiors, L.L.C., and Android.
- Delta Township residents that do not work in the City of Lansing do not owe city income tax.

Residents that are registered to vote in Delta Township, or pay their water and sewer bill to Delta Township are Delta Township residents. If residents discover that their employer withheld City or Lansing taxes in error, simply contact the Clerk's office and they will provide the employer with proper identification. If you have any questions regarding whether or not you are a Delta Township resident, please contact the Clerk's office and they will be happy to assist you.

### Neighborhood Watch Meeting

On **Wednesday, May 7 at 6 p.m.**, the Eaton County Sheriff's Office will hold a Neighborhood Watch Forum at the Delta Township Administration Building located at 7710 West Saginaw Highway. This meeting is designed to provide information and assistance to anyone interested in helping to organize a new neighborhood watch group, as well as to help strengthen and renew our relationships with existing neighborhood watch groups. Residents will have the opportunity to meet with representatives of the Eaton County Sheriff's Office Delta Patrol, and discuss ways to fight crime in their neighborhoods.

### Child's Guide to Emergency Help: Dial 911

911 is your emergency telephone number. You need to know how and when to call 911 in case you ever need help. You can reach fire and police departments and ambulance services by dialing 9-1-1.

#### There are four reasons to call 911.

1. To get help for someone who is hurt or very sick.
2. If you smell smoke or see a fire.
3. If you see someone stealing something or hurting someone.
4. If you need emergency help fast for any reason.

**REMEMBER:** Don't call 911 to ask questions or to play a joke. This number is for emergencies only.

#### How to make an emergency call to 911:

Stay calm. Don't get excited. Take a deep breath.

Dial 911 right away. Don't wait for someone else to call.

Tell the person who answers the phone exactly what is wrong, like this:

"... my house is on fire."

"... there was just a car accident in front of my house."

"... my Daddy is hurt - he fell off a ladder and can't move."

"... I'm home alone and someone is trying to break in."

Tell them the exact address where the emergency is ... be sure to give the FULL address, including your apartment number if you live in an apartment. Tell them the phone number you are calling from. If you are not at the same address as the emergency, tell them the address where you are. Tell them your name.

DO NOT HANG UP...until the person on the telephone tells you to. They may need to ask you more questions to help the fire, police or ambulance find you. They will also tell you what to do until help arrives.

## Voter Registration

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office, or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates may be made at any Secretary of State office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will also be applied to your voter registration.

## Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's office is always looking for dependable citizens for its precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's office.

## Permanent Absent Voter List

Citizens over 60, physically challenged, or frequently out of the community, may be placed on the permanent absent voter list. Permanent absent voters will automatically receive an application for all elections. By Michigan Election Law, this application must be completed, and returned for every election in order to receive a ballot. For more information regarding the Delta Township's permanent absent voter list, please contact the Clerk's office, or see our website at [www.deltami.gov/elections](http://www.deltami.gov/elections).

## Change of Address

If you move within a city or township, you must update your address. This can be handled by the Clerk's Office or at a Secretary of State Branch office. Whenever you move to a new city or township or move within your current city or township you must update your voter registration or re-register to vote.

## First-Time Voter

If you have never voted in Michigan and register by mail, you must appear in person to vote in the first election in which you wish to participate. This requirement does not apply if (1) you personally hand deliver the mail-in registration form to you county, city or township clerk's office instead of mailing the form (2) you are 60 years of age or more (3) you are disabled or (4) your are eligible to vote under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act.



## Passport Drive

The Delta Township Clerk's office will be offering three additional passport drives during 2014.

One official passport quality photo is required when submitting a passport application, and may be obtained at the Clerk's office for a \$12 fee per applicant.



The Delta Township Clerk's Office will be open on the following dates in 2014 for the acceptance of passport applications:

- Wednesday, April 16 – 5 p.m.- 7 p.m.
- Saturday, August 2 – 8 a.m.- 2 p.m.

Fees collected must be in the form of a personal check or money order. No credit cards, or debit cards, can be accepted for payment of passport application fees. Two payments will be required: (1) payable to the Department of State for processing of your passport, and (2) payable to Delta Township for pictures, and the acceptance fee.


