



## Ongoing Power Outage Resources for Citizens

The weather is expected to remain very cold through the next several days. If you do not have heat in your home, you are encouraged to go to a shelter. If you have an immediate medical need, please dial 911.

For non-emergency needs, please dial 211.

### Sheltering and Warming

The Red Cross has opened a **shelter** at Trinity Church, at 3355 Dunckel Road in Lansing. If you have questions about the shelter call the Red Cross at 517-325-3574.

If you need a **ride to a shelter**, dial 211.

Trinity Church is also a **warming center** where people can go to spend a few hours to warm up.

The Mt. Hope Church (Delta Township) is a **warming center**. This warming center is open from **8 am – 5 pm**. The Church is located at 202 N. Creyts Road, in Delta Township.

The Lansing Mall (Delta Township) is a designated **warming center**. This warming center is open during mall hours only (**10 am – 9 pm**). The Mall is located at 5330 West Saginaw Highway, in Delta Township.

### Power Restoration

It is not known when power will be restored in your neighborhood. The Board of Water and Light has extra crews working on the remaining problems.

## **Safety**

Never leave candles burning unattended. Be especially careful with candles around children and pets. Keep matches and lighters out of the reach of children.

### **Avoid carbon monoxide poisoning:**

Never place generators indoors or in unventilated areas.

Never use gas or charcoal grills indoors.

Never use propane heaters that are not approved for indoor use.

Never use your oven for heating.

You cannot see or smell carbon monoxide. The symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning are: headache, nausea, dizziness and weakness.

If you suspect carbon monoxide poisoning, immediately go outside and call 911.

Take care of yourself and your family during this emergency. Check on elderly relatives and neighbors. Don't forget to take care of your pets as well.
