

Passport Drive

The Delta Township Clerk's Office accepts passport applications during regular office hours Monday-Friday, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. year round.

Troop 111's Flag Collection

The flag collection kiosk was constructed by the troop in support of an autistic scout's Eagle project. Since being located at the Delta Township Recycling Center they have handled well over



3000 flags. Some were good flags that were no longer needed. These flags have been used to replace tattered flags that they sometimes find on display. The rest have been retired in dignified ceremonies following proper flag disposal procedures. Troop 111 has also provided flags to veteran organizations for their ceremonies, involved other troops in ceremonies, and annually hold a significant ceremony while serving as the Governor's Honor Guard on Mackinac Island.

Mercury - A Persistent Problem

Persistent: Existing for a long or longer than usual time or continuously; continuing to exist despite interference or treatment; degraded only slowly by the environment [Merriam Webster]. Mercury is a persistent pollutant! Once it reaches the environment it can remain in sediment and be released into the water for a long time. The Delta Township Utility Department remains persistent in our efforts to make sure that less mercury is being discharged; however, we are finding that despite efforts at "interference or treatment" mercury is a persistently difficult pollutant to reduce or eliminate. We have made some progress but continue to need the support of our residents. The good news in the ongoing battle is that we are beginning to see a consistent reduction in amount of mercury received at the treatment facility which results in lower levels remaining following treatment and less going into the environment.

There is a large component to controlling mercury that the Utility Department has no control over, however, and that is the mercury that could potentially be discharged from homes. If you have never completed an inventory of your home to identify sources of mercury it would be beneficial to do so. Items that could potentially have mercury include: thermometers, thermostats, fluorescent lamps, mercurochrome, button-cell batteries, some older paints, chemistry sets, and weights/counterweight in grandfather clocks. Instructions on how to clean up small mercury spills can be found at *https://www.ats-dr.cdc.gov/mercury/docs/residential_hg_spill_cleanup.pdf*. If you feel you have been exposed to mercury and have questions about potential health affects you can call your local poison control center at 1-800-222-1222.

Most importantly, NEVER DISPOSE OF MERCURY BY FLUSHING DOWN A DRAIN OR TOILET! This includes any residual powder that might result from breaking one of the new high efficiency light bulbs. These bulbs contain low levels of mercury so handle with care!

The Utility Department will be glad to answer any questions you may have in regard to mercury sources, proper handling, disposal, or other related queries. Feel free to call us from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday at 323-8570.

Differences between Storm Sewers (Storm Drains) and Sanitary Sewers

A sanitary sewer is for wastewater while a storm drain is for rain water. Sanitary sewers are the responsibility of the Delta Township Utility Department (323-8570) to maintain, while storm drains are the responsibility of the Eaton County Road Commission/Eaton County Drain Commissioner.

Sewers that collect wastewater from our houses are called sanitary sewers. Indoor drains (sinks, bathtubs, washing machines, toilets, etc.) go to a sanitary sewer. These drains are connected to a series of piping that carries wastewater to a treatment plant. Once at the treatment plant, many harmful materials are removed, and the wastewater is discharged into the environment. Sanitary sewers are not designed to carry storm water.

Sewers that carry rainwater and other items that wash off the streets are called storm drains. The grate that prevents larger objects from flowing into the storm system is called a catch basin. Storm drains are located outside and are not connected to the system of pipes that carries wastewater to a treatment plant. Anything dumped into storm drains flows directly into a pond, stream, river or some other body of surface water. In all areas of Delta Township, the storm water goes directly to local waterways without any treatment.

Have you ever driven through a flooded street? Water drains off streets through catch basins located along the curb in the low areas. When catch basins are covered with grass clippings, paper, leaves, and other debris, the rainwater can not flow away when it rains hard. Residents can be a big help in preventing street flooding by following a few simple preventative maintenance tips:

- Avoid placing grass clippings or leaves into gutters along the road where they are washed into catch basins, covering them.
- Remove debris, such as paper, leaves, grass, and other materials, that collect in the roadway or over any catch basin on or near your property.

Rain water can become contaminated and cause severe damage to our local water bodies and to every living thing that depends on them for drinking water, habitat, and recreation. In the first rush of water from a rainstorm, much of the debris and other pollutants that had settled on the land surface and in the storm drain since the last storm will be picked up and carried into the local receiving water body. This can significantly add to water quality problems. Therefore, it is important to protect the storm drain system from sources of pollution.

In addition to the items mentioned above, the following should never be dumped down storm drains, road gutters or catch basins: motor oil, pet waste, and chemicals of any kind. Anything dumped in a storm water collection system will eventually end up in a local water body. Most likely, it is a water body that many of us have enjoyed and used in one form or another.

Residents can make a difference. Here are some examples of what local residents might do at home to help keep our local waterways (storm drains) clean. Landscape with the environment in mind. Choose the appropriate plants, shrubs and trees for the soil in your yard; do not select plants that need lots of watering and increases surface runoff. Follow label directions when using fertilizers or pesticides and apply when rain is not forecasted. Divert rain from paved surfaces, if possible, onto grass to permit gradual infiltration. Reduce impervious surfaces by using pavers or bricks rather than concrete for a driveway or sidewalk. Maintain vehicles properly so that motor oil and other fluids do not contribute to water pollution.

Vending and License Requirement

Spring and summer is the time of year when there is an increase in vending. Please be aware a valid pictured vendor license is required by the Township Clerk for vending activity in the Township either door-to-door or from a fixed commercial site. Vending licenses are NOT required for groups representing a school, religious organization or charitable organization which is classified non-profit for federal internal revenue purposes. A license is also not required if vendor leaves a brochure at a resident's home and does not knock or engage the resident.

Residents should ask to see a license if they are approached by a vendor if the license is not visible. If a vendor does not have a Township issued license, residents should contact the Sheriff's Department at 372-8217 x 2. All other questions regarding this ordinance should be directed to the Delta Township Clerk's Office at 323-8500.



Greetings from the Office of the Eaton County Magistrate

As I predicated it got cold and snowy for the winter. What I didn't anticipate was just how cold it would get, but hope-fully as you read this article we should be warming gradually as the temps rise and the sun stays out longer.

I wanted to pass along some information that I received from the commanding officer of the Delta Township Sheriff patrol, Lt. Mark Wrigglesworth. Lt. Wrigglesworth sent me the statistics for traffic crashes in Eaton County during 2017.

Traffic crashes are up in Eaton County from 1136 in 2016 to 1304 in 2017. The following top ten locations are all located in Delta Township:

As you can see Saginaw Hwy from Waverly Road to Marketplace Blvd is an extremely high traffic crash area. Given the amount of daily vehicular traffic it is not that unusual for traffic crashes to occur on this stretch of roadway. However, many crashes can be avoided.

I would like to remind you that in each of the traffic crashes, the cause was most likely attributed to the actions of one or more drivers. Speed, texting, cell phone use, weather conditions or disregarding traffic signals, or signs have all contributed to these crashes occurring. I anticipate that as Spring arrives more and more vehicles will utilize this roadway for travel and the likelihood for crashes to occur will also increase.

Please use extra care and caution while driving on Saginaw Hwy and be especially cognizant of your speed and driving habits to avoid any mishaps from occurring.

The addition of the new traffic signal light at Broadbent and Saginaw Hwy will hopefully alleviate the number of traffic crashes occurring at that location. As an aside, the Secretary of State is increasing certain points on traffic violations this year. This could have an impact on insurance rates for the future.

In the upcoming issue I will discuss the importance of making a disposition on any traffic violation(s) so as to avoid any unnecessary fines or fees or license suspensions.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's Office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board, especially those with STRONG computer skills. Voter Registration

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's Office in the township in which they reside. Updates can be made at any Secretary of State Office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will also be applied to your voter registration. A voter registration form can be mailed to your local clerk.

Permanent Absent Voter List Request

If you are over 60, physically challenged, or frequently out of the community, you can be placed on our permanent absent voter list to vote by absentee ballot for future elections. Our permanent absent voters will automatically receive an application for all elections that are scheduled in Delta Township. However, the application for an absentee ballot must be completed and returned to the Clerk's Office for every election, as required by Michigan Election Law, before a ballot can be sent to a voter. Voting By Absentee Ballot
