1.0 CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS

- General Contractor, Commercial Contracting Corporation (CCC), is on site full time for supervision, safety, processing submittals and RFI's, and planning the work.
- CCC continued installing the Aeration Tank wall reinforcement by tying the mats on the foundation and raising them into place with the crane. CCC installed wall reinforcements around Aeration Tanks No. 4 and 5, and in the west halves of the interior walls. CCC has poured the south center lower wall section, the southeast upper wall section, and the center wall section between Aeration Tanks No. 4 and 5.
- CCC completed installation of the remaining metal stud walls and drywall in the Control Building
 Conference Room for the cloud ceiling, and in the Electrical Room. CCC finished the drywall around the
 windows and throughout the Control Building. CCC completed installation of the wood fascia around the
 exterior of the Control Building.
- CCC continued installation of the suspension ceiling grid in the Control Building. CCC began installation
 of the acoustical ceiling tiles in the Control Building hallways, offices, Conference Room, and Break
 Room.
- CCC installed the millwork, countertops, windowsills, and interior doors in the Control Building.
- CCC coordinated temporary plant communication and SCADA operation with SE, Delta Township, and Tetra Tech due to delays in equipment arrival.
- Subcontractor Leidal & Hart (L&H) completed installation of the split face and brick on the Electrical Building. L&H completed washing the brick on the west and south sides of the Control Building.
- Subcontractor Traverse City Glass installed the aluminum windows in the Control Building.
- Subcontractor Rayhaven Group delivered the Control Building lockers to the site.
- Subcontractor Allied Mechanical Services, Inc. (AMS) completed installing insulation around the
 plumbing throughout the Control Building. AMS installed the drinking fountains, toilets, sinks, and
 fixtures in the Control Building Restrooms, Kitchen, and Locker Rooms. AMS completed installing the
 piping and pressure tank for the water heater in the Mechanical Room.

- AMS installed the return and supply air registers in the Control Building. AMS installed the exhaust fans, ductwork, and louvers in the Control Building.
- Subcontractor Superior Electric of Lansing (SE) continued routing raceways and conduit through the interior of the Control Building and pulling wire.
- SE continued installing outlets, light switch, and faceplates throughout the Control Building. SE completed installation of the overhead light fixtures inside the Control Building and began installing exterior lights and outlets.
- SE installed transformers and lighting panel breakers in the Control Building and Electrical Building. SE completed pulling wire and turned on the permanent power to the Control Building.
- Subcontractor Hoffman Bros. began repairing the north, west, and south slopes of the Aeration Tank
 excavation to meet safety standards. The work inside the Aeration Tanks on those sides was temporary
 suspended until the excavation was stabilized and approved by CCC safety.
- Hoffman Bros. backfilled around the exterior of the Aeration Tank Foundation slab with pea stone.
- Subcontractor Christen Detroit completed installation of the aluminum fascia and gutters around the Control Building and on the gables.
- Subcontractor RAM Construction completed caulking the hollow metal door frames and exterior masonry control joints throughout the Control Building.
- Subcontractor Murray Painting Company continued priming and painting the Control Building interior
 walls, door frames, and doors. The south offices, Mud Room, Mechanical Room, Restrooms, and Break
 Room have all received the final coats of paint.
- Subcontractor Lansing Tile and Mosaic continued installation of floor, wall, and backsplash tile in the Control Building. All tile installation except for the south vestibule has been completed.
- Tetra Tech is on site full time and is working on shop drawing review, addressing RFI's, and observing the work.





1.0 CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS

- Prime Contractor Dunigan Bros. planning the work, processing submittals, coordinating with Barton Malow and General Motors, and supervising the work and safety.
- Subcontractor Kelly's Dewatering was onsite from February 27th through March 2nd installing the dewatering system (five deep wells) for the lift station site. Commenced dewatering on March 3rd.

2.1 CHANGES

- Three proposal requests have been issued related to the changes in anticipated sanitary flow from the Ultium 3 site as reported to Delta Township through the Ghafari design team.
 - Proposal Request 1 Add \$68,890.25
 Increase pump size from 15 HP to 20 HP, revisions to the wet well and valve vault piping to accommodate three pumps instead of two as originally designed.



- Proposal Request 2 Add \$118,174.72
 Increase size in the precast wet well and valve vault to accommodate the revised three pumps.
- Proposal Request 3 TBD
 Modifications in the electrical service to accommodate the flow revisions.

On February 20, 2023 the Township Board approved Change Order No 2. At this time, Change Order No 3 is being presented for your consideration.

The change order includes several items, which have all have been reviewed by staff, and staff are in agreement that these change items should be incorporated into the project. The items will be reviewed by EGLE SRF staff and verify eligibility to be applied to the SRF contingency funds for the project. Due to the Headworks Utility Reroute item being time sensitive, Board approval is being sought concurrently with EGLE review.

SUBJECT: Authorization to Execute the Participation Agreement for the National Opioid

Settlement Agreements

Over the last several years, many states as well as municipalities entered into litigation relating to the opioid epidemic. Recently, a settlement was negotiated with Teva, Allergan, CVS and Walmart. While Delta Township was not part of the initial multi-district litigation, the State Attorneys General negotiated an acceptance of national Settlement Agreements, of which they are encouraging each local municipality to participate.

An executive summary of the details of this settlement is provided with this memo.

If Delta Township participates in the national settlement and Michigan-based allocation agreement, the Township will receive 0.068% of the settlement amount that will be distributed to local governments. The national settlement restricts use of these funds, but the permissible uses relate broadly for training, first responder support, research and prevention. As part of the terms of participation in the settlement agreement, the Township would forego its right to individually file litigation against the defendants.

- 3. An Agreement by CVS to pay up to \$4.90 billion over 10 years;

4. An agreement by Walmart to pay up to \$2.74 billion in 2023, and all payments to be made within 6 years.

Executive Summary of National Opioid Settlements

[2.03.2023. Subject to ongoing corrections and updates]

In 2021, nationwide settlements were reached to resolve all opioids litigation brought by states and local political subdivisions against the three largest pharmaceutical distributors—McKesson, Cardinal Health, and AmerisourceBergen ("Distributors")—and against manufacturer Janssen Pharmaceuticals, Inc. and its parent company Johnson & Johnson (collectively, "J&J"). These "2021 National Settlements" have been finalized, and payments have already begun. In all, the Distributors will pay up to \$21 billion over 18 years, and J&J will pay up to an additional \$5 billion over no more than nine years.

In late 2022, agreements were announced with three pharmacy chains—CVS, Walgreens, and Walmart—and two additional manufacturers—Allergan and Teva. In January 2023, each of those pharmacy chains and manufacturers confirmed that a sufficient number of states had agreed to the settlements to move forward. As with the 2021 National Settlements, states and local governments that want to participate in the 2022 National Settlements now will have the opportunity to "opt in." The greater the level of subdivision participation, the more funds will ultimately be paid out for abatement. Assuming maximum participation, the 2022 National Settlements require:

- Teva to pay up to \$3.34 billion over 13 years and to provide either \$1.2 billion of its generic version of the drug Narcan over 10 years or \$240 million of cash in lieu of product, as each state may elect;
- Allergan to pay up to \$2.02 billion over 7 years;
- CVS to pay up to \$4.90 billion over 10 years;
- Walgreens to pay up to \$5.52 billion over 15 years;
 and
- Walmart to pay up to \$2.74 billion in 2023, and all payments to be made within 6 years.

(These figures include amounts attributable to prior settlements between the Defendants and certain states/subdivisions and amounts for attorneys' fees and costs.)

Under both the 2021 and 2022 National Settlements, at least 85% of the funds going directly to participating states and subdivisions must be used for abatement of the opioid epidemic, with the overwhelming bulk of the proceeds restricted to funding future abatement efforts by state and local governments.

In addition to providing billions of dollars for abatement, the settlements also impose changes in the way the settling defendants conduct their business. For example:

- The Distributors will create a groundbreaking clearinghouse through which they will be required to account not only for their own shipments, but also the shipments of the other distributors, in order to detect, stop, and report suspicious opioids orders;
- J&J (which ceased marketing Opioids in 2015 and ceased selling Opioids in 2020) will not market or sell any opioid products in the next ten years and has agreed to cease lobbying concerning prescription opioids for ten years;
- Teva and Allergan have agreed to strict limitations on their marketing, promotion, sale, and distribution of opioids, including a ban on: (1) promotion and lobbying; (2) rewarding or disciplining employees based on volume of opioid sales; and (3) funding or grants to third parties; and
- Walmart, CVS, and Walgreens are required to implement changes in how they handle opioids, including requirements addressing their compliance structures, pharmacist judgment, diversion prevention, suspicious order monitoring, and reporting on red-flag processes, as well as blocked and potentially problematic prescribers.

The 2021 and 2022 National Settlements are the culmination of many years of intense negotiations among representatives of the State Attorneys General, the court-appointed Plaintiffs' Executive Committee and Negotiation Committee, which are comprised of lawyers in the National Prescription Opiate MDL who represent subdivisions, and counsel to the Settling Defendants. These negotiations were facilitated by Judge Dan Polster (who oversees the federal MDL litigation), by the Special Masters appointed by the MDL Court, and by experienced, neutral mediators.

The agreements do not settle or release any claims brought by Tribes or by private parties, including private individuals, private hospitals, or private third-party payers.

- The proposed Michigan State-Subdivision Agreement for the Teva, Allergan, CVS, and Walmart Settlements.

The Participation Form for each settlement must be executed, without alteration, and submitted on or before April 18, 2023, in order for your subdivision to be considered for initial participation calculations and payment eligibility.

The proposed Michigan State-Subdivision Agreement for the Teva, Allergan, CVS, and Walmart Settlements is included for reference. This agreement is in the process of being ratified. The agreement defines the distribution between the State

and Local Subdivisions and determines the allocation percentage of each Local Subdivision.

Based upon subdivision participation forms received on or before April 18th, the subdivision participation rate will be used to determine whether participation for each deal is sufficient for the settlement to move forward and whether a state earns its maximum potential payment under the settlement. If the settlement moves forward, your release will become effective. If a settlement does not move forward, that release will not become effective.

Any subdivision that does <u>not</u> participate cannot directly share in the settlement funds, even if the subdivision's state is settling and other participating subdivisions are sharing in settlement funds. Any subdivision that does <u>not</u> participate may also reduce the amount of money for programs to remediate the opioid crisis in its state. MICHIGAN STATE-SUBDIVISION AGREEMENT FOR ALLOCATION OF ALLERGAN, TEVA, CVS, AND WALMART SETTLEMENT AGREEMENTS

The People of the State of Michigan and its communities have been harmed by misfeasance, nonfeasance, and malfeasance committed by certain entities within the pharmaceutical industry. The conduct of such Pharmaceutical Entities has caused, or contributed to the existence of, a public nuisance associated with the opioid public health epidemic.

The State, through its Attorney General, and Litigating Local Governments, through their elected representatives and counsel, are separately engaged in litigation seeking to hold the Pharmaceutical Entities accountable for the damage caused by their misfeasance, nonfeasance, and malfeasance by seeking compensation for past damages and imposing the equitable remedy of nuisance abatement. The State and Litigating Local Governments litigated their claims in their proprietary, sovereign, and quasi-sovereign capacities.

To allocate monetary payments received from these Pharmaceutical Entities, the State and Litigating Local Governments agree to the following State-Subdivision Agreement:

I. Definitions

As used in this Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU"):

- A. "Administrative Fund" is 0.3% of the Local Government Share.
- B. "Actual Attorney Fees" are the aggregate contingent fees paid to a Local Litigating Attorney for work performed for a Litigating Local Government for the Settlements and associated litigation, based on a Litigating Local Government's Actual Total Recovery. This does not include any fee payments for common benefit work as defined by the Settlements.
- C. "Actual Total Recovery" is the aggregated monetary recovery that an individual Litigating Local Government receives, based on that Litigating Local Government's Final Allocation Percentage and aggregate Local Government Share.
- D. "De minimis-share Local Government" is a Participating Local Government whose Final Allocation Percentage is less than .0083%.

- E. "Final Allocation Percentage" is a Participating Local Government's Allocation Percentage as modified by the Litigation Adjustment.

 Attached as Exhibit A is the Final Allocation Percentage for each Local Government.
- F. "Litigating Local Government Attorneys" are the law firms who were retained by the Litigating Local Governments.
- G. "Litigating Local Government Attorney Fee Fund" ("LLGAFF") is an annually adjusted percentage of the Local Government Share set aside for Projected Attorney Fee installment payments.
- H. "Litigating Local Governments" are the entities indicated as litigating in Exhibit C of this agreement.
- I. "Litigation Adjustment" is an adjustment applied to the Preliminary Allocation Percentage.
- J. "Local Government Share" is the portion of the Settlement Payments payable to Participating Local Governments pursuant to this State-Subdivision Agreement.
- K. "Local Governments" are the entities located within the geographic boundaries of the State of Michigan and identified in the Exhibits that identify the eligible Local Governments of each of the Settlements.
- L. "National Contingency Fee Fund" are the individual Contingency Fee Funds established in the Settlements to compensate Litigating Local Government Attorneys.
- M. "National Fund Administrator" is the Settlement Fund Administrator as defined by the Settlements.
- N. "Neutral Special Master" is an independent mediator selected by the State.
- O. "Opioid Remediation" is the term as defined by the Settlements.
- P. "Participating Local Governments" are the Local Governments who have signed a Participation Agreement for the Settlements.
- Q. "Parties" are the State and the Litigating Local Governments. The singular word "Party" shall mean either the State or Litigating Local Governments.
- R. "Pharmaceutical Entities" are the "Released Entities" as defined by the Settlements.

- S. "Preliminary Allocation Percentage" is the percentage listed for a Participating Local Government in Exhibit B of this agreement.
- T. "Projected Attorney Fees" are the anticipated contingent fees paid to a Litigating Local Government Attorney for work performed for a Litigating Local Government for the Settlements and associated litigation, based on a Litigating Local Government's Projected Total Recovery. This does not include any fee payments for common benefit work as defined by the Settlements.
- U. "Projected Total Recovery" is the aggregated monetary recovery that an individual Litigating Local Government is projected to receive based on that Litigating Local Government's Final Allocation Percentage and aggregate Local Government Share.
- V. "Settlements" are the Allergan, Teva, CVS, and Walmart national settlement agreements related to opioids and entered by the State in December 2022.
- W. "Settlement Payments" are scheduled monetary payments received through the Settlements.
- X. "Special Circumstance Fund" is 5% of the Local Government Share.
- Y. "State" is the State of Michigan acting through its Attorney General or her designees.
- Z. "State Share" is the portion of the Settlement Payments payable to the State pursuant to this State-Subdivision Agreement.

II. Terms

- 1. <u>Participation in Settlements</u>: The Parties agree that to participate in the Settlements, Local Governments must execute a Participation Agreement.
- 2. <u>Opioid Remediation</u>: All Settlement Payments shall be utilized by Participating Local Governments and the State for Opioid Remediation, except as otherwise allowed by the Settlements. A minimum of 70% of Settlement Payments must be used solely for future Opioid Remediation.

3. Distribution:

Settlement Payments are allocated as follows:

- 50% of Settlement Payments to the Local Government Share
- 50% of Settlement Payments to the State Share
- 4. <u>Local Government Share Offset</u>: Prior to Participating Local Governments receiving their Final Allocation Percentage of the Local Government Share, amounts will be deducted for the following funds:
 - Administrative Fund
 - Litigating Local Government Attorney Fee Fund
 - Special Circumstance Fund
- 5. <u>Litigation Adjustment</u>: The Parties recognize that the Litigating Local Governments expended time, resources, and assumed risk in the pursuit of litigation against the Pharmaceutical Entities. In recognition of this commitment and contribution, the Litigating Local Governments are entitled to a Litigation Adjustment of 12%.
- 6. Accelerated Participation Payments: Prior to the distribution of the State Share, the National Fund Administrator shall allocate the Projected Total Recovery for all De minimis-share Local Governments from the State Share to those De minimis-share Local Governments. This allocation shall be made in the first Settlement Payment. In subsequent Settlement Payments, the National Fund Administrator shall direct distributions of all De minimis-share Local Governments to the State Share.
- 7. Non-Participant Reallocation: If a non-county Local Government does not participate in the Settlement, then that non-county Local Government's share shall revert to the county(ies) in which it is located. If a county Local Government does not participate in the Settlements, that county's share shall be reallocated to the Participating Local Governments.
- 8. <u>Litigation Costs</u>: To the extent that Litigating Local Government Attorneys receive cost reimbursement from the National Contingency Fee Fund, then such reimbursed costs shall be deducted from any remaining entitlement to costs as provided under individual retention agreements.

9. Attorney Fees:

- a. Attorney fee payments shall be paid from the LLGAFF, but only in years where Settlement Payments to the Local Government Share are greater than \$0.00.
- b. Projected Attorney Fees shall be calculated as 15% of an individual Litigating Local Government's Projected Total Recovery, as previously agreed upon in the Michigan State-Subdivision for the Distributor and Janssen Settlements. Projected Attorney Fees shall be paid in equal installments over the shorter of: (i) the first seven Settlement Payments; or (ii) the total number of Settlement Payments.
- Litigating Local Government Attorneys must apply to the c. National Contingency Fee Fund and seek the maximum allowable contribution to their fee. To the extent that a Litigating Local Government Attorney applies to the National Attorney Contingency Fee Fund and the National Attorney Contingency Fee Fund does not pay the Projected Attorney Fee annual installment payment, the LLGAFF shall pay the deficiency for that year. If a Litigating Local Government Attorney does not apply to the National Attorney Contingency Fee Fund, the LLGAFF shall not pay any deficiency. A Projected Attorney Fee payment from the LLGAFF may not exceed any restrictions in the Teva, Walmart, CVS, or Allergan Settlement Agreements, respectively, that restrict the amount of settlement funds that may be allocable to non-Opioid Remediation purposes from each of those settlements.
- d. Actual Attorney Fees shall be no greater than 15% of a Litigating Local Government's Actual Total Recovery.
- e. If a Litigating Local Government's Actual Total Recovery is less than the Projected Total Recovery, the Litigating Local Government Attorney shall return the amount received that is greater than 15% of the Litigating Local Government's Actual Total Recovery.
- f. The Parties shall endeavor to reconcile any timing discrepancies between fee payments from the National Contingency Fee Fund and the LLGAFF to assure payment of a 15% Attorney Fee.
- 10. <u>Special Circumstance Fund</u>: An application to receive additional funding for any local impact of the opioid epidemic that is not captured by a Local Government's Allocation Percentage may be submitted to

the Neutral Special Master for consideration. The Neutral Special Master will decide the additional funding to be paid, if any, to all applicants on an application-by-application basis. Any additional funding allocated under this paragraph shall only be paid from the Special Circumstance Fund. The deadline for initial applications shall be determined by the Michigan Department of Attorney General and reviewed for allocation determination by the Neutral Special Master. The allocation decisions of the Neutral Special Master shall be final and not appealable. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Local Governments may submit applications to revise the Special Circumstance Fund allocation determinations on March 29, 2030 to reflect changes in circumstances, and the Neutral Special Master may prospectively adjust the allocation of the Special Circumstance Fund at that time. Local Governments are limited to one application prior to the initial deadline and one subsequent application on March 29, 2030. Application to the Special Circumstance Fund may not be made with the express purpose of offsetting the Litigation Adjustment. The Neutral Special Master shall be paid solely from the Administrative Fund.

- 11. <u>Allocation of Remaining Local Government Share</u>: The remainder of the Local Government Share after offsets shall be distributed to Participating Local Governments in accordance with each Participating Local Government's Final Allocation Percentage.
- 12. <u>Escrow Agent</u>: An Escrow Agent shall be agreed upon by the State and a majority of the Litigating Local Governments to administer the distribution of the Local Government Share and all funds contained within it pursuant to this State-Subdivision Agreement. The Escrow Agent shall be entitled to a reasonable fee for their services, which shall be paid solely from the Administrative Fund. Alternatively, the Parties may explore whether the Escrow Agent's role can be fulfilled by the Settlement Fund Administrator as that term is defined in the Settlements.

13. Reversion to Local Government Share:

a. Any amounts remaining in the Administrative Fund shall remain in such fund until all anticipated administrative costs associated with implementation of this agreement have been paid, after which any remaining funds may revert to the Local Government Share for distribution to Participating Local Governments in accordance with their Final Allocation Percentage.

b. Any amounts remaining in the LLGAFF after paying the Projected Attorney Fee annual installment payment shall revert to the Local Government Share for distribution to Participating Local Governments in accordance with their Final Allocation Percentage. Any amount reverted to the Local Government Share shall be distributed no later than the next Settlement Payment.

III. Other Terms and Conditions

- 1. Governing Law and Venue: This agreement will be governed by the laws of the State of Michigan. Any and all litigation arising under the agreement, unless otherwise specified in this agreement, will be instituted in either: (a) the Court that enters the Order if the matter deals with a matter covered by the Order and the Court retains jurisdiction; or (b) the appropriate State court in Michigan.
- 2. <u>Modification</u>: This agreement may only be modified by a written amendment between the appropriate Parties. No promises or agreements made after the execution of this agreement shall be binding unless expressly reduced to writing and signed by the Parties.
- 3. <u>Execution in Counterparts</u>: This agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 4. <u>Assignment</u>: The rights granted in this agreement may not be assigned or transferred by any Party without the prior written approval of the other Party. No Party shall be permitted to delegate its responsibilities or obligations under this agreement without the prior written approval of the other Parties.
- 5. Additional Documents: The Parties agree to cooperate fully and execute any and all supplementary documents and to take all additional actions which may be reasonably necessary or appropriate to give full force and effect to the basic terms and intent of this agreement.
- 6. <u>Captions</u>: The captions contained in this agreement are for convenience only and shall in no way define, limit, extend, or describe the scope of this agreement or any part of it.
- 7. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: This agreement, including any attachments, embodies the entire agreement of the Parties. There are no other provisions, terms, conditions, or obligations. This agreement

- supersedes all previous oral or written communications, representations, or agreements on this subject.
- 8. <u>Construction</u>: The Parties hereto hereby mutually acknowledge and represent that they have been fully advised by their respective legal counsel of their rights and responsibilities under this agreement, that they have read, know, and understand completely the contents hereof, and that they have voluntarily executed the same. The Parties hereto further hereby mutually acknowledge that they have had input into the drafting of this agreement and that, accordingly, in any construction to be made of this agreement, it shall not be construed for or against any Party, but rather shall be given a fair and reasonable interpretation, based on the plain language of the agreement and the expressed intent of the Parties.
- 9. <u>Capacity to Execute Agreement</u>: The Parties represent and warrant that the individuals signing this agreement on their behalf are duly authorized and fully competent to do so.
- 10. <u>Effectiveness</u>: This agreement shall become effective on the date on which the last required signature is affixed to this agreement.



BUILDING PERMIT VALUES OF CONSTRUCTION YEARLY COMPARISON












RENTAL PROGRAM

- There are currently 333 rental properties with 6,673 rental units registered in Delta Township. Over a threeyear cycle roughly 1/3 of the properties/ units are inspected and required to be certified each year.
- 58 properties and 815 units did not comply or receive certification by the end of 2022.
- In addition to the increase in rental units, post-covid there has been a significant decline in the conditions of properties as well as ability to achieve compliance. This may be due to loss of maintenance staff and constant changes in management, resulting in a negative effect on the quality of housing stock.

ENFORCEMENTS

The Building Codes, Property Maintenance Codes, Nuisance Ordinances and Sign Ordinance are enforced by the issuance of tickets for non-compliance. Prior to the Civil Infraction ordinance, all court proceedings were conducted through formal hearings using an attorney, costing thousands of dollars in legal fees.

ENFORCEMENT GOALS

Code Enforcement Goals for 2023

- 1. Create consistent enforcement of all ordinances/codes Township wide through interdepartmental cooperation.
- 2. Full utilization of the civil infraction process with the goal of achieving compliance quicker and more effectively.

To achieve this, Kelly Figueiredo and Sean Haskin are conducting a property maintenance study of both residential and commercial properties to propose a vacant property registration ordinance/ program, red tagged property monitoring ordinance/ program, propose a cyclical commercial building property maintenance inspection program and Sign Ordinance review.



CODE ENFORCEMENT

Post-pandemic, the Code Enforcement Division has seen a significant increase in violations and lack of compliance. This applies to both residential and commercial properties.



- 1 inmate clean up
- Final injunctive order granted the township the authority to demolish if the property was not brought into compliance.
- House demolished in October 2022.



- An injunctive order was issued to remove the occupants and require the house be brought into compliance.
- The property remains vacant and red tagged and unauthorized entry is continued suspected.




