DELTA CHARTER TOWNSHIP

Between 1940 and 1967 Delta Township's population roamed from 2,618 to nearly 26,000, and its state tax evaluation increased from \$1.48 million to \$475 million. Charter status, attained in 1962, helped fuel an explosion that gave Delta the moniker "fastest growing township in Michigan." Local government services are now directed from this building, which was completed in 1970. As farms became residential subdivisions and apartment complexes, the township created an extensive recreation facility. The Sands Moon house, a log cabin built around 1855, was moved to Woldumar Nature Center in 1983, when a large industrial plant was built on its original site. There it became a walk-in demonstration museum commemorating Delta's early pioneers.

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DELTA TOWNSHIP BOARD

The Charter Township of Delta is governed by a seven member board under a Board-Manager form of government. Policy-making and legislative authority are vested in the board which consists of a supervisor, treasurer, clerk, and four trustees all of which are elected at large. Board members serve four-year concurrent terms. The board is responsible for, among other things, adopting ordinances, approving the annual budget, appointing committee and board members, and hiring the township manager. The manager, in turn, is responsible for overseeing the day-to-day operations of the township and implementing the policies and ordinances as adopted by the township board.

The Charter Township of Delta has approximately 146 full-time equivalent employees. Services provided include water, waste water, fire and ambulance, contracted police, and recreational and cultural events. In addition to general governmental services, Delta Township is a thriving and dynamic community that supports education, planned growth, safety, and a positive community fabric. Our community is committed to the concept of being a great place to live, work, and play.



VOTER REGISTRATION

A person may register to vote at either a Secretary of State office or at the Clerk's office in the township/city in which he/she resides. Michigan law requires that a driver's license and voter registration must be the same address. Updates may be made at any Secretary of State throughout Michigan.

GEOGRAPHY

Delta Township is located in Eaton County and is bordered by Watertown Township to the North, Oneida Township and the City of Grand Ledge to the West, Windsor Township and the City of Dimondale to the South, with Lansing Township and the City of Lansing to the East. Delta Township is a suburb of Lansing. Delta Township has a total area of 33.21 square miles, of which, 32.46 square miles is land and 0.74 square miles is water. It is located mid-way between Detroit and Grand Rapids. Three major Interstate Highways pass through Delta and include Interstates 69, 96, and 496. Saginaw Highway (M-43) is the major thoroughfare with many commercial businesses located along the road.



TRANSPORTATION

There are several different types of transportation routes in Delta, which include surface roads, highways, and expressways that run through and around the township. Buses for public transportation are owned and operated by EATRAN and CATA. Both provide demand-response services throughout the township. CATA also operates bus routes in portions of the township's eastside that travel to downtown Lansing.

There are also non-motorized transportation routes in the township including on-street bike lanes, shared use paths, and sidewalks.

DELTA TOWNSHIP DEPARTMENTS

Accounting Department - (517) 323.8510

Finance Director: Jeffrey Anderson

The Accounting department maintains a centralized reporting system that provides accounting and related services to the public and township departments by integrating billing, accounts payable, accounts receivable, payroll, and cash management functions. Staff prepares and receipts monthly utility billings, as well as, receipts and distribution of property taxes. Residents may also purchase dog licenses from this department year round.

The Assessing department provides property tax assessments to township property owners and businesses. Staff prepares the annual summer and winter tax rolls, including the authorization for the collection of taxes. Staff also maintains detailed and accurate records for over 13,000 township property parcels. The Delta Township Assessing Department also provides assessing services for the City of Grand Ledge.

Clerk's Office - (517) 323.8500

Township Clerk: Mary R. Clark

The Clerk's office is the information hub for Delta Township. Staff manages township records, voter registration, elections, business registrations, solicitor licenses, special event licenses, and accepts applications for board and commission seats, as well as election workers. Passports may be obtained during regular business hours, from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, and during other special times as scheduled by the department. The Clerk's office provides information on the recycling center hours and events. The Clerk's office also offers EATRAN tokens at a discounted rate. Cemetery plots are available in the Delta Hillside and Delta Center Cemeteries, which Delta Township residents may purchase at a discounted rate. Cemetery plot assignments are made by the Clerk's office. Contact the Clerk's office for more information.

Engineering & Planning Division Director: Mark Graham

Building Division Director: Ted Droste

The Building Division administers the building, plumbing, electrical and mechanical codes as well as the property maintenance code. This division is also responsible for the licensing of all residential rental properties including hotel rooms. The Building Division administers the Township's blight and sign ordinances.

The Economic Development Division is responsible for attracting new businesses to the Township and retaining existing businesses. The Division conducts frequent calls on businesses, responds to site search requests, and serves as the support staff to the Delta Township Economic Development Corporation.

The Engineering Division prepares studies and engineering plans/specifications for water and sanitary sewer projects. The Division also inspects sanitary sewer and water projects, prepares as-built drawings, and reviews utility plans related to new building construction. The Engineering Division is responsible for the Township's sidewalk construction and repair programs.

The Planning Division is responsible for the preparation and updating of the Comprehensive Plan, the administration of the Zoning Ordinance and the annual drafting of a six-year capital improvements program. The Planning Division serves as the support staff to the Township's Planning Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals.

The Fire Department provides fire, rescue, and emergency medical services to the citizens of Delta Township, Eagle Township, and Watertown Township. Staff also provides instruction and literature to local school children for education regarding fire safety, and works in partnership with surrounding jurisdictions to provide emergency response utilizing its three fire stations. The Central Fire Station is responsible for all administrative business, and is open to the public between the hours of 8 a.m. - 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The Delta Township District Library provides library resources, services, and programs necessary to meet the evolving educational, recreational, and informational needs of the community. Numerous programs are held throughout the year at the library and around the community for a variety of ages and interests.

The Township Manager is the Chief Administrative Officer of the Township and is responsible for all township departments. The Manager's office is responsible for the implementation of township board policies, development and implementation of all personnel policies, to plan, coordinate and present the annual township budget, provide leadership and coordination of staff, and is responsible for managing the daily operations of the township. In addition, information technology is coordinated by this office.

Parks, Recreation & Cemeteries Department - (517) 323.8555

The Parks, Recreation, and Cemeteries Department provides a wide variety of sports and leisure programs, children, adults and seniors classes, many events for individuals and families, such as, DeltaRocks! Family Festival, Music in the Park, Annual Fireworks Display, etc. In addition, this department is responsible for the administration and development of township parks and facility rental, performs all facets of cemetery maintenance and operation, and provides for the maintenance and operation of the recycling center.

Utility Department - (517) 323.8570

Utility Director: Tom Morrissey

The Utility department has the responsibility to plan, organize, and supervise activities related to construction, inspection, operation, and maintenance of public utilities and property owned by the township, which includes the township's water and waste water systems.



ORDINANCE REMINDERS

Township officials are working hard to make sure that every neighborhood, residential, or commercial, is a good one, but we need your help. Good neighborhoods are made up of good neighbors. Following are reminders of the things that can help:

LEASHED ANIMALS

Our Leashed Animals on Public Property Ordinance states that it shall be unlawful for any person while on public property, including public streets, public sidewalks, public trails, and public park property within the Township to bring, drive, lead or carry any dog or small animal or pet which is unleashed, or which is on a leash longer than six feet or capable of extending longer than six feet onto any public property in the Township, unless a specific area is designated for unleashed dogs, small animals or pets.

BLIGHT

Local ordinance prohibits, in any area of the township, the storage or accumulation of junk. The term “junk” shall include (but is not limited to) dismantled motor vehicles, vehicle parts, dismantled machinery or parts, unlicensed or inoperable trailers, discarded appliances, scrap metal, building materials (unless there is a valid building permit), garbage, trash, yard debris or any other miscellaneous cast-off items.

This provision does not apply to the outside storage of farm machinery, or parts thereof on agricultural zoned properties. This machinery must be owned by the occupant, and not stored for the purpose of salvage or resale.

GARAGE SALES

Spring and summer are prime seasons for cleaning out the old and for organizing your possessions. With that comes garage sales and yard sales, which helps in “recycling” our possessions. Local ordinance states that garage sales, rummage sales, yard sales, estate sales, and similar activities shall not be conducted on residentially zoned properties for more than three consecutive days, and no more than twice per calendar year on the same property.

INOPERATIVE/JUNK CARS

Township ordinance states that in any area of the township, the parking upon any property of junk vehicles, except within a completely enclosed building is prohibited. The term “junk vehicle” shall include: **A.** Is not currently licensed for use upon highways in Michigan; **B.** Does not display a current, valid license plate; or **C.** Is inoperable for any reason. This provision does not apply to com-

mercial garages, dealerships, or body shops that provide storage within fenced areas, which completely obscure such vehicles from view.



OVERNIGHT PARKING

Within the boundaries of Delta Township, no person shall park any vehicle, including a vehicle used for commercial or recreational purposes, or any trailer on either side of any highway, freeway, street, or roadway between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. of any day.

NOXIOUS WEEDS

Township ordinance prohibits any growth of noxious weeds, grass, or other rank vegetation to a greater height than 12 inches on the average - nor permit any accumulation of dead weeds, grasses, or brush to a height greater than 12 inches on average. It is the duty of the occupant of every premise, and the owner of any unoccupied premise within the township to cut and remove or destroy all such noxious weeds and grass. This must be done as often as necessary throughout the growing season, between April 15th and October 31st of each year.

If an occupant/owner allows grass or weeds to exceed the 12 inches in height limit, the township will cut or destroy such weeds or grass. The cost of doing so, plus 10% for overhead shall be assessed against the property of the taxpayer as shown on the tax roll.

SIGNS

Our Sign Ordinance is intended to apply reasonable regulations concerning the use of signs and outdoor advertising structures, in order to prevent excessive visual clutter. It also ensures that signs and sign structures are designed, constructed, installed, and maintained so as not to constitute a safety hazard.

No person shall erect, replace, apply, structurally alter, or add to any sign without first obtaining a permit. Application for a permit shall be made to the township building official, by submission of the required forms, fees, exhibits, and information by the owner of the property on which the sign is to be located, or by his agent or lessee. ORDINANCE REMINDERS (CONTINUED)

FIRE DEPARTMENT CODE OF ORDINANCES – SECTION 7-49.5

The chief is authorized to render interpretations of this code, to make and enforce rules and supplemental regulations in order to carry out the application and intent of its provisions. Such interpretations, rules and regulations shall be in conformance with the intent and purpose of this code and shall be available to the public during normal business hours, which are from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

PERMITS REQUIRED

Rule 08-105.6.1 Explosives: An operational permit is required for the manufacture, storage, handling, sale or use of any quantity of explosives, explosive materials, fireworks or pyrotechnic special effects.



Rule 08-105.6.3 Open Burning: An operational permit is required to conduct open burning on public or private property (see Chapter 7 Article III of the Fire Prevention Code in the Charter Township of Delta Michigan Code of Ordinances).

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Rule 08-105.6.4 Carnivals and Fairs: An operational permit is required to conduct a carnival or fair.

Rule 08-105.6.4.3 Temporary Membrane Structures, Tents and Canopies: An operational permit is required to erect or operate an air-supported temporary membrane structure or tent having an area in excess of 200 square feet or a canopy in excess of 400 square feet, except for structures used exclusively for camping.

Rule 08-105.6.3.6 Pyrotechnic Special Effects

Material: An operational permit is required for use and handling of pyrotechnic special effects material.

The Delta Township Board of Trustees has established a \$10.00 (ten dollar) fee for the following required permits:

- Explosives
- Carnivals and Fairs
- Temporary Membrane Structures, Tents and Canopies
- Fireworks/Pyrotechnics for Public Display

Fees shall be collected by a member of the Delta Township Fire Department prior to the issuance of any permit.

BURNING PERMITS

Delta Township residents must obtain a burning permit for any burning within the township. There is no charge to obtain a burning permit and it is valid for the entire calendar year.

Please note that burning of yard waste is ONLY allowed in areas zoned agricultural. Small recreational fires are allowed in areas zoned residential if the appropriate permit has been issued by the fire department.

No grass, leaves, garden debris, twigs, etc. may be burned in areas zoned residential.

Burning permits must be obtained at the Central Fire Station located at 811 North Canal Road during normal business hours. Please call 517.321.6622 for further information. There is no charge to obtain a burning permit.

THE DELTA TOWNSHIP BURNING ORDINANCE IS STRICTLY ENFORCED.

PASSPORT SERVICES

PASSPORT DRIVE

If you are in need of a new passport, or to renew your existing passport, and find it difficult to get to our office during regular hours the Delta Township Clerk's office offers extended passport drives on Saturdays and evenings. Contact the Clerk's Office at 323.8500 or go to www.deltami.gov for specific times and dates. One picture is required when submitting a passport application and may be obtained at the Clerk's office for a \$12.00 fee.

Please visit the U.S. Department of State website for documentation requirements, fees, and application forms at www.travel.state.gov. Two payments are required: (1) Payable to Department of State for processing of your passport, and must be in the form of a personal check or money order, and (2) Payable to Delta Township for pictures and service fee, which can be in the form a personal check, money order or cash. For questions or further information please contact the Delta Township Clerk's office at 323.8500.

DELTA TOWNSHIP CLERK'S OFFICE PASSPORT ACCEPTANCE AGENCY

The Clerk's office accepts applications for the processing of U.S. Passports, and Passport Cards, on Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., with no appointments necessary.

NEW PASSPORT APPLICANTS

All applicants age 16 and over applying for the first time, or any minor age 16 and under whom have never applied for a passport must apply in person.

Persons wishing to obtain U.S. Passports and/or Cards must provide the following when applying for a passport:

1. Completed application (Do not sign application. Signature required after oath administered.)
2. Citizenship documentation
3. One 2" x 2" picture taken within last six months
4. Valid proof of identification

COMPLETED APPLICATION

A Passport application may be obtained from the Passport Acceptance Agency (Delta Township Clerk's office) or on the National Passport Information Centers website at www.travel.state.gov.

CITIZENSHIP DOCUMENTATION REQUIREMENT

Previously issued U.S. Passport, Certified Birth Record with raised seal, which may be obtained from the county where birth took place or State office of Vital Records, Consular Report of Birth Abroad or Certification of Birth, Naturalization Certificate or Certificate of Citizenship. Additional documentation will be required for persons that have been adopted, foster guardianship, legal name change or have a delayed birth record.

IDENTIFICATION

Previously issued U.S. Passport, Naturalization Certificate, Valid Driver's License, Current Government ID (city, state or federal) or current Military ID. If applying with out of state identification a second form of identification will be required.

PASSPORT SERVICES (CONTINUED)

EXPEDITED SERVICE

Expedited service may be requested by paying the \$60.00 expedited service fee for each application in addition to required fee when applying. You should plan on 2-3 weeks processing time of your passport application. The processing time does not include mailing time. Mailing an expedited application will also cost an additional \$18.11 postage fee made payable to Delta Township.

OVERNIGHT MAIL DELIVERY

It is strongly suggested that you use overnight delivery service if you have paid additional fee for expedited of your passport application due to upcoming travel plans. To request overnight delivery, pay an additional \$12.85 for each application, made payable to US Department of State in addition to required passport fees. Once a passport is processed it will be mailed to applicant by overnight mail delivery.

TRAVELING IN LESS THAN 2 WEEKS

You must apply in person at the nearest passport agency – Detroit Passport Office – 221 West Fort Street, 2nd Floor, Detroit. Appointment required. Call 877.487.2778 to schedule an appointment.

MINORS UNDER AGE 16 REQUIREMENTS

Minors 16 and under must apply in person with parents/guardians and the following documents:

1. Completed application (not signed until oath given at passport acceptance agency)
2. Childs evidence of US Citizenship
3. Evidence of Relationship between child and parents/guardians
4. Identification of parents/guardians
5. Notarized parental Consent form (#DS-3053) if one parent/guardian is unable to appear when applying or signed notarized statement from missing parent/guardian.
6. Fees
7. 1 - 2" x 2" Passport photo

MINORS AGE 16 & 17 REQUIREMENTS

Minors age 16 & 17 must apply in person with following documents:

1. Completed application (not signed until oath given at passport acceptance agency)
2. Evidence of US Citizenship of minor
3. Valid proof of identification (driver's license or school identification if available)
4. Parents/guardians valid proof of identification if minor has no picture identification. (It is recommended that a front and back copy of driver's licenses of both parents/guardians be submitted with application).
5. Parental Consent (Parent/guardian present at submittal of application) – If a parent/guardian is present with minor at submittal of application, parent/guardian must sign application. It is recommended that non appearing parent/guardian submit notarized form DS-3053 or notarized signed statement authorizing consent to apply for passport.
6. Parental Consent (Parent not present at submittal of application) – If parents/guardians are not present with minor at submittal of application, both parents/guardians must submit notarized form DS-3053 or notarized signed statement authorizing consent to apply for passport.
