





Residents should refer to their voter identification card for the appropriate precinct number and polling location. If your voter identification card has been lost, contact the Clerk's office for a replacement to be mailed.

Voter Registration

A person may register to vote at a Secretary of State office, or at the Clerk's office in the township in which they reside. Updates may be made at any Secretary of State office throughout Michigan. If you submit a driver's license address change, it will also be applied to your voter registration.

Election Workers

Delta Township depends on residents to help in the election process. The Clerk's office is always looking for dependable citizens for our precinct polling locations and absent voter counting board. Residents are paid for working on Election Day. Anyone interested should contact the Delta Township Clerk's office. Applications to be an Election Inspector for 2014 are available at the Delta Township Clerk's office.



Military and Overseas Voter Empowerment Act ("Move Act")

The Move Act was signed into law in 2009 affording all active uniformed service members, spouses, dependents, merchant marines stationed inside or outside the United States, and civilians residing indefinitely or temporarily overseas, the option of requesting an "electronic" transmitted, faxed or mailed absentee ballot. The voter must submit a written request or utilize the FPCA form requesting ballot every calendar year (January 1-December 31) and must be filled out in its entirety. The FPCA completed form can be utilized to register to vote and/or apply for an absentee ballot, and may be e-mailed to delta-tw@miqvf.org or faxed to 323-8599 to the attention of the Clerk's office. The FPCA form used for this request is available on the Township website at www.deltami.gov for your convenience. Additional information, including contact information for Michigan's City and Township Clerks, sample ballots for you to view for upcoming elections, or candidate and proposal information may be viewed through the Michigan Voter Information Center (MVIC) website maintained by the Michigan Department of State at www.michigan.gov/vote.

Change of Address

If you move within a city or township, you must update your address. This can be handled by the Clerk's Office or at a Secretary of State Branch office. Whenever you move to a new city or township or move within your current city or township you must update your voter registration or re-register to vote.

First-time Voter

If you have never voted in Michigan and register by mail, you must appear in person to vote in the first election in which you wish to participate. This requirement does not apply if (1) you personally hand deliver the mail-in registration form to your county, city or township clerk's office instead of mailing the form (2) you are 60 years of age or more (3) you are disabled or (4) you are eligible to vote under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act.


